Kia ora Cathedral Whānau,
A special welcome to all the visitors
to Nelson Cathedral this morning
– human and animal alike –
as we gather for our annual
Pet Blessing Service.

This year we are making a special feature of welcoming the Godwits back to the Nelson-Tasman region after their 12,000km flight from Alaska.

All creatures are special, but this is truly an amazing feat, the longest bird migration in the world, which even gets a mention in textbooks. We will be ringing the Cathedral bells at 11.15am to mark the arrival of the Godwits and you are welcome to remain at the Cathedral to mark this event.

Last weekend our Nelson Anglican Diocesan Synod (AGM) was held in Blenheim and one of the motions that was passed was about creation care in the face of climate change. Humans have a God-given role to care for all of creation - in fact this was the first command God gave to humanity.

Care of creation is also at the heart of our Anglican DNA as the fifth mark of mission for the global Anglican church: "To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth".

So, as we gather today to give thanks for our pets (and for some our cuddly animal-shaped toys) and the comfort and joy they bring, may we remember that we all have a role to play in caring for our world, our environment, and all the creatures that share this world with us. As we do this, we are being God's hands and feet in the world so we can share God's love with all living things.

²⁰ And God said, 'Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.' ²¹ So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. ²² God blessed them, saying, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.' ²³ And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day. ²⁴ And God said, 'Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.' And it was so. ²⁵ God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good. ²⁶ Then God said, 'Let us make humankind in our image, according to our

likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.'

²⁷ So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

¹⁹ So out of the ground the LORD God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. ²⁰ The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner.
