As we head into the New Year, there are several topics that we will be considering. First, Bishop Steve has asked each parish to join the Diocese in discerning God's leading as we address issues such as declining numbers. One way we will begin to do this at the Cathedral is to include a new prayer into our service as we ask God to speak to us. Can I invite you to also use this prayer at home during the week and do let me know if you feel God is saying something specific for the Cathedral or Diocese.

Second, one of the motions that came out of Synod last year was a commitment for each parish to undertake the ecochurch survey (<https://www.ecochurch.org.nz/>). The aim is to identify one action point to achieve this year so that we can actively care for God's earth as an integral part of our mission.

Finally, on the evening of Friday March 10 and then the Saturday morning March 11, we are hosting a short-course titled, "*Going Deeper into John's Gospel*" run by Professor Paul Trebilco who is Head of the Theology Programme at the University of Otago (and also son-in-law of Bruce Kaye). As Paul explains, "John is clearly a profound Gospel, which is rich in meaning. We'll seek to understand more of those rich depths in this short course, and so to appreciate the theology of the Gospel of John and its portrait of Jesus".

The session will focus on John 1:1-18 and John 13:1-20 and discuss three key themes:

- The relationship between the Father and the Son in John's Gospel.
- Women in John's Gospel.
- The Spirit in John's Gospel.

As you read about these three topics, you might recognise that there is a connecting thread as we discern God's will, step out into mission by caring for creation, and deepen our understanding of God's word. These are all aspects of the call to come and meet Jesus and follow - all aspects of discipleship. May we take hold of these opportunities to grow our faith individually and together.

I Corinthians 1:10-18

¹⁰ Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you should be in agreement and that there should be no divisions among you, but that you should be united in the same mind and the same purpose. ¹¹ For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. ¹² What I mean is that each of you says, 'I belong to Paul', or 'I belong to Apollos', or 'I belong to Cephas', or 'I belong to Christ.' ¹³ Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴ I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵ so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶ (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷ For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. ¹⁸ For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.
