
Trinity Sunday is an important Sunday as we reflect on the nature of God. There is much formal theology around understanding God as Trinity, but at its heart, this understanding of God reflects Gods self-revelation to us and our experience of God. We worship one God, and God has been revealed to us as Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - eternally existing in relationship as three, equal in every way where one cannot be distinguished from the other. Therefore, God is the perfect community of love into which we and the whole of creation have been included.

The Christian church has expressed this specific view of God in the words of the Nicene Creed which we say every week. The origins of this Creed (statement of faith) began in 325AD at the first universal Council of the Christian Church held in Nicaea. Here the Bishops gathered to define the relationship of God the Father and Jesus the Son. Interestingly, the Creed follows the early Church's pattern outlined by Paul in I Corinthians 15:1-6, 20-28. The second universal Council held in Constantinople in 381AD, further refined this work and added the divinity of the Holy Spirit. And so we have the Nicene Creed which we say today to express our faith in one God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Unity is an important part of our understanding of Trinity, and an important part of our life together in society. As an Anglican Church we express our unity in diversity through our 3-Tikanga structure, where the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi (a document with a very strong Christian basis) have guided the structure of the Anglican Church in Aotearoa New Zealand and Polynesia so we can flourish by respecting our cultural diversity but acknowledging our oneness in Christ (more about this next week as we celebrate Te Pouhere Sunday). So as we come to Trinity Sunday we celebrate our life in God. May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all, especially today.

### The Proclamation of the Word The Old Testament Lesson

**Genesis 18:1-14** Read by Ernie Leaning

The LORD appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day.  $^{2}$  He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. <sup>3</sup> He said, 'My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant. <sup>4</sup> Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. <sup>5</sup> Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass onsince you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.' <sup>6</sup> And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready guickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.' <sup>7</sup> Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. <sup>8</sup> Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.<sup>9</sup> They said to him, 'Where is your wife Sarah?' And he said, 'There, in the tent.' <sup>10</sup> Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.' And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. <sup>11</sup> Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. <sup>12</sup> So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, 'After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?' <sup>13</sup> The LORD said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh, and say, "Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?" <sup>14</sup> Is anything too wonderful for the LORD? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son.'

#### The New Testament Lesson Galatians 3:26-4:7

<sup>26</sup> For in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. <sup>27</sup> As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. <sup>28</sup> There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. <sup>29</sup> And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

**4** My point is this: heirs, as long as they are minors, are no better than slaves, though they are the owners of all the property; <sup>2</sup> but they remain under guardians and trustees until the date set by the father. <sup>3</sup> So with us; while we were minors, we were enslaved to the elemental spirits of the world. <sup>4</sup> But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, <sup>5</sup> in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. <sup>6</sup> And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our<sup>[C]</sup> hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' <sup>7</sup> So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.


# Nelson Cathedral: Hapori Hub
